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### WORKSHOPS

#### **Airway Management**

*Enhancing proficiency in managing the difficult or critical neonatal/infant airway using multidisciplinary training leaders*

This session will provide demonstrations by multidisciplinary trainers using specialized airway equipment, including special laryngoscopes, videolaryngoscopes, fiber optic laryngoscopes-bronchoscopes and laryngeal mask airways. Participants will have an opportunity to visit multiple stations, have hands on practice with the newest airway technologies and participate in manikin based simulation exercises for experience in intubation and managing the difficult or critical airway and will develop an algorithm for identifying and managing the difficult or critical airway, incorporating strategies learned.

#### **CIQI Mr. Potato Head: Learn to do QI, Blindfolded!**

*QI methodology and tools for data collection, display and analysis*

#### **CIQI Science**

*Quality Improvement Science – Data Collection and Analysis Techniques*

Learn the basics of using data to assess for improvement in your projects. This 1-hour, fast-paced, hands-on workshop will cover common vs special cause, types of data (advantages and disadvantages), types of measurements, sampling considerations, why we look at data over time graphically, and generating run charts.

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### WORKSHOPS

#### **Nursing Leadership**

*Nurses Leading Change and Transforming Care*

Nurses are to be seen as leaders, influencers, advocates and change agents. To solidify this viewpoint, we will discuss how nurses can pursue roles that go from the bedside to the boardroom, from the breakroom to the classroom. Three broad areas will be focused on: practice, leadership and education. Nurse leaders move beyond managing discrete parts of an organization to integrating the interrelationship of the parts through the utilization of systems thinking to achieve operational excellence. This provides the focus on healthcare transformation on redesign of systems and teams, reduction of waste and cost, and the improvement of outcomes.

***Intended Participants:*** Any symposium participant, with a focus on nurses, interested in learning how to become influential in transforming how we lead, using systems-based thinking, defining more clearly nurses equal partnership in team work and how to use data to drive better outcomes for our patients

#### **Survey Writing**

*Designing Effective Surveys*

This session will give participants the tools needed to create high quality surveys to effectively measure outcomes for a wide range of projects. Participants will complete a practice survey that will serve to frame discussion about the key concepts of question writing, choice of response formats, and strategies for summarizing primarily quantitative responses. The session will be very interactive with numerous opportunities to practice applying key concepts by using a worksheet and quality control checklist to critique example questions. Participants will leave with a step-by-step guide and resource packet.
