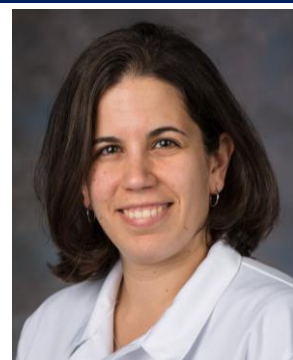
Gone FISHing: Everything You Were Afraid to Ask About Genetic Testing in the NICU

Recent advances in genetic testing which increase diagnostic yield and/or shorten turnaround time mean more neonates in level IV NICUs are getting, or should be considered for, genetic testing. Using a combination of didactics and case-based discussions, participants will become aware of the options and limitations for genetic testing in Children's Hospitals NICUs. Emphasis will be placed on developing the knowledge and skills needed to partner with a clinical geneticist and/or genetic counselor to select the appropriate test(s) for a patient's clinical situation. Time and interest permitting, we will discuss system-level barriers to implementing a neonatal genomics program and solutions from different CHNC sites.

Moving from “PDSAs” to Publication: Fundamentals of Success and Common Editorial Problems

The pediatric community are leaders in the application of quality improvement (QI) methodology to improve medical care. However, many interprofessional improvement teams fail to share their lessons learned, methods, and new processes that lead to better outcomes in peer-reviewed publication. Joan Smith and Rick McClead will conduct a workshop that will cover the fundamentals of QI publication using the Standards for Quality Improvement Reporting Excellence (SQUIRE) guidelines. They will also address common problems and errors editors see with many QI manuscript submissions.

Data Charts in Quality Improvement: What, When and How
